For agricultural application, you can get a bail spear or custom configured hayforks to help to move and stack hail bails. You may get additional long forks of you need more reach in your own applications.

Besides buckets and forks, there are lots of hydraulic attachments that can be purchased and used on your machine. These hydraulic attachments come in almost any size and shape to do any task you can think of. Some of the most well liked hydraulic tools are hammers, brushes, and augers. You can utilize hammers to break up little rocks or a concrete sidewalk what is getting redone.

Brooms are often put on at the end of a job to ensure to scrub up all of the days work. Augers are employed a lot to dig holes much quicker and meticulously than the everyday spade.
